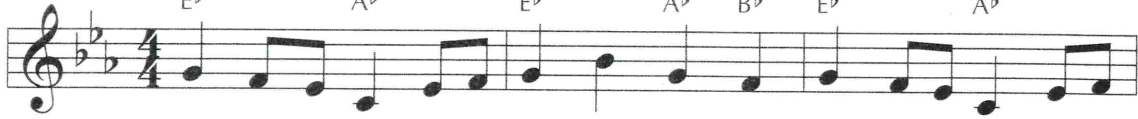

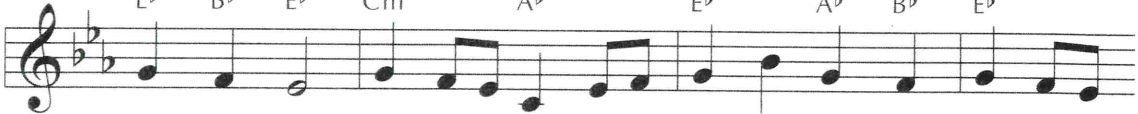



**Sermon Series: Through the Bible, Letter of James.** The letter is addressed to Christians “in the dispersion,” evidently living outside of Palestine in other areas of the Roman empire. The author offers a series of admonitions to readers to maintain good Christian character, and patiently wait for the return of the Lord.

In the New Testament, five men are given the name “James.” Some scholars tell us that the one with the best chance of authoring this letter is James, the Lord’s brother, who is believed to have died in 62 C.E. Other scholars have reasons for not accepting this theory. Such reasons include the letter’s cultured Greek, unlikely the product of a simple Palestinian whose mother tongue was Aramaic; and the slow acceptance of the letter’s authenticity by Early Church Fathers. Perhaps a disciple of James, the Lord’s brother, was involved in the writing and editing. “...Even if the letter is not authentic, it appeals to the famous James and the weight of his person as authority for its content.” –Werner Georg Kuemmel, Introduction to the New Testament.

**The Season of Easter begins** with the Day of Resurrection and ends on the Day of Pentecost seven weeks later. “The Great Fifty Days” comprise the most festive season of the Christian year. The color white is used in liturgical vestments and paraments, symbolizing the season’s joyful spirit. Scripture selections recall Jesus’ appearances during the forty days between his resurrection and ascension, and then the ten days of waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Easter season is a time during which we are reminded of the presence of the risen, living Christ in our midst, and challenged to live in light of this profound truth.

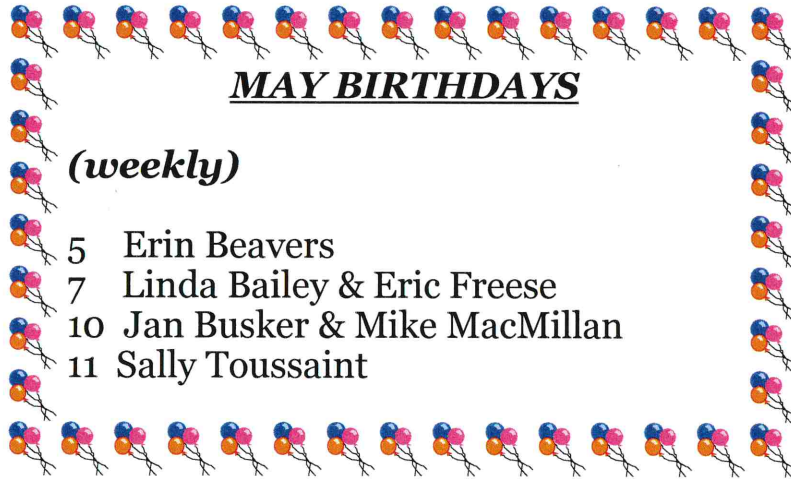

Dear The Rev Kalyn:

Monarch Watch is pleased to award First Presbyterian Church of Edwardsville one flat of milkweed plants to be planted in your monarch/pollinator garden as you described in your Free Milkweed application.

**A reply is required to accept this award.** Please double-check your shipping address below and reply with corrections if necessary.

You will receive another email when shipping is eminent (early to mid-spring for your region).

Milkweed orders will be shipped via UPS Ground early in the week to arrive before the weekend. They will be shipped directly from the nursery through UPS Ground. You will receive a tracking email when your plants ship. Shipping will continue while weather permits. Your plants will be triple-inspected for quality prior to shipment. Monarch Watch is not responsible for damage to milkweed plants during transit.

Please note: Plants may arrive trimmed of foliage and, because they are not treated with pesticides, may have pests. The nursery takes care to send healthy plants with viable root systems.

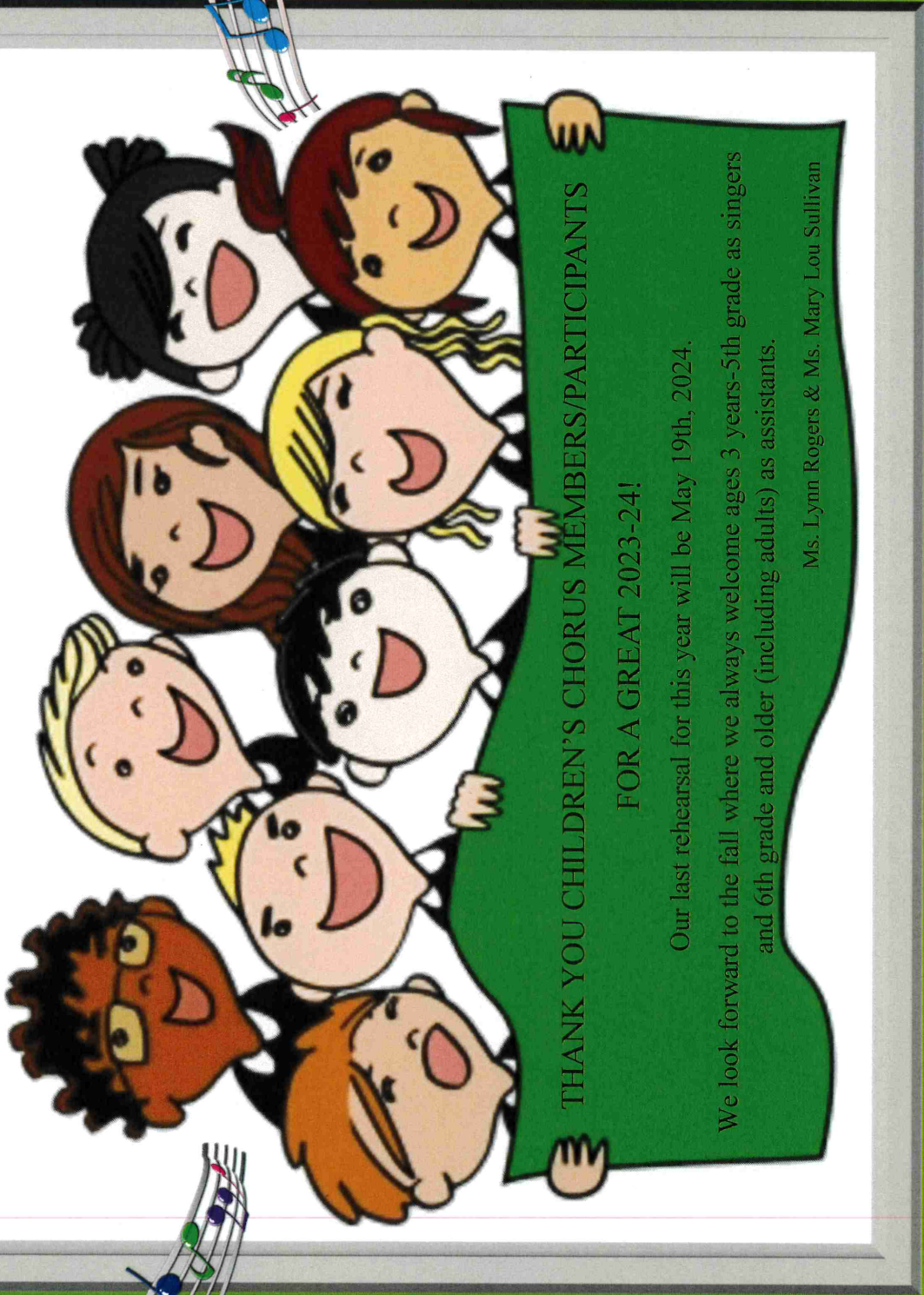
