




Pastor and Administrative Staff

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Why make a pledge?

For you, the pledge process provides a structured opportunity to think about stewardship, and pray about your financial responsibility to the church. The pledge itself represents an act of faith, and functions as a tangible barometer against which God's provision and your faithfulness can be measured. For the church's leaders, the pledges became a reasonable estimate of the church's giving, enabling more effective planning of the ministry budget.

For what time period does my 2024 pledge apply?

The pledge year is on a calendar basis and reflects your anticipated giving from January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024. Your pledge may be adjusted (up or down) at any time during the year if your circumstances change. If you are not sure when during the year you will be able to meet your pledge, you do not have to make a weekly pledge commitment – it could be an annual total – whichever is more easily manageable for you.

How should I determine an appropriate amount?

The level of your giving is a spiritual issue to be worked out between you and God. The Old Testament sets forth the "tithe" (or 10% of income) as a model. The Bible as a whole tells us that all we have belongs to God. As faithful stewards we are to give generously out of gratitude for God's blessings, returning to God for special use a portion of what we have received. This year's campaign asks you to evaluate your giving by percentage of income.

When do I make my 2024 pledge?

A pledge card may be found in your informational mailing. An easy way to return a pledge is to send it by e-mail to office@fpcedw.org. You may complete your paper card, place it in a sealed envelope, and mail it. The card may be delivered by you personally to the church office, placed in the offering plate during Sunday worship services. Your card must be received in the church office by Friday, December 1 for your pledge to be dedicated during the December 3rd Commitment Sunday service of worship.

PLEDGING BY PERCENTAGE OF INCOME

Researchers tell us that, on average, American Christians give between 2 and 3 percent of their income to the church. The chart below will help you quickly estimate 2½ percent of your projected income, a suggested stewardship goal.

If this is your first time making a pledge, and 2½ % seems too large a step, the try 1% of your income. If you have been pledging at the same level for a few years, consider pledging at a higher percentage level. If you are tithing 10%, you are an inspiration!

Pray about your level of giving, and enter your new pledge on the 2024 pledge card. Thank you for your support of First Presbyterian Church Edwardsville.

This pamphlet tells a story of ministry, and explains in numbers what it costs to enable and nurture it. Some items are dollar-intensive, while other items are time-intensive. The numbers are a snapshot in time, and will vary according to the results of the pledge campaign and changes in the budget, as approved by our governing board, the Session. A pledge-campaign summary and detailed budget will be prepared and distributed in the annual report.

Pledge Commitment Sunday is December 3. On that day, we will gather up our pledges, and dedicate them to God's honor and the building up of the church. As we prepare, your financial support means more now than ever to keep faithful, fruitful ministry alive and thriving in the year to come. With respect for your partnership in our congregation's mission, we ask you to prayerfully reflect upon making and perhaps increasing your pledge, then returning your pledge via e-mail to the church office, through the campaign's Google survey, or with a paper pledge card in the offering plate or USPS.
